The cancer clinical research community suffered a tremendous loss on September 22, 2016 with the passing of Daniel J. Sargent, PhD, due to a sudden unexpected illness. Dan was a lifelong resident of Minnesota. He earned a BS in Mathematics and PhD in Biostatistics from the University of Minnesota, and then joined the faculty of the Mayo Clinic Rochester in 1996. At the time of his passing, he was the Ralph S. and Beverley E. Caulkins Professor of Cancer Research, and the Chair of the Division of Biomedical Statistics and

Informatics in the Department of Health Sciences Research at the Mayo Clinic. Dan was a world expert in the area of oncology clinical trials. Read more

### SPOTLIGHT ON ALLIANCE TRIALS Stereotactic Radiosurgery May Be Best for Patients with Metastatic Brain Tumors

Patients with three or fewer metastatic brain tumors who received treatment with stereotactic radiosurgery (SRS) had less cognitive deterioration three months after treatment than patients who received SRS combined with whole brain radiation therapy (WBRT). These findings are according to the results of an Alliance trial - NCCTG N107C A phase III trial of post-surgical stereotactic radiosurgery compared with whole brain radiotherapy (WBRT) for resected metastatic brain disease - published recently in the Journal of the American Medical Association.
